

Health and Safety Risk Assessment



The recent COVID-19 risk assessment has been developed in response to the COVID pandemic, which resulted in a countrywide lockdown and temporary ceasing of all work activities relating to Glasgow Ski & Snowboard Centre (GSC or 'the Club') as of the 20th March 2020. This risk assessment forms part of GSC's Proposed Reopening Strategy.

The main symptoms of COVID-19, also regularly referred to as the 'coronavirus', include fever, cough or chest tightness, muscle pain, fatigue and breathing difficulties. Symptoms can be mild, moderate, severe, or fatal.

This risk assessment should be read in conjunction with the following risk assessments associated with each of the various activities undertaken at the Club.

- General
- Skiing
- Snowboarding
- Tubing
- Functions
- Maintenance
- Activity Camps
- Snow Trips Abroad

This COVID-19 risk assessment will supersede all other GSSR risk assessments where information may be contradictory. All other hazards and mitigation measures presented in the above risk assessments will still apply.

This COVID-19 risk assessment will be in place until the Scottish Government guidance indicates that the threat of COVID-19 has passed.

The information presented in this risk assessment does not negate staff's personal responsibility to the health and safety of both themselves and others, including Clients of the Club, in line with the Scottish Government's general lockdown restrictions.

This risk assessment will be reviewed regularly for the duration in which it is in effect. Any updates to the hazards or the mitigation measures described herein will be circulated to staff and made available for Clients via the Club website (<https://www.ski-glasgow.co.uk/>).
